CHAPTER 398  
HOUSE BILL 1222

AN ACT TO TRANSFER TITLE TO CERTAIN LAND FROM THE STATE OF  
NORTH CAROLINA TO THE TOWN OF ANDREWS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. There is transferred, in fee simple absolute, from the State of North Carolina to the Town of Andrews, title to that tract or parcel of land in the Town of Andrews, North Carolina, more particularly described as follows:

"All of that certain tract of land containing 10 acres, more or less, in Cherokee County set apart and established as a public burying ground by act of the General Assembly of North Carolina entitled 'AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A PUBLIC BURYING GROUND IN THE COUNTY OF CHEROKEE', ratified on the 8th day of January, 1847, and now known as Valletown Cemetery within the corporate limits of the Town of Andrews."

Sec. 2. This transfer of title shall be represented by a quitclaim deed from the State to the Town of Andrews as soon as may be practical for the preparation and signing of the deed pursuant to the provisions of Article 16 of Chapter 146 of the General Statutes.

Sec. 3. This act is effective upon ratification.

In the General Assembly read three times and ratified, this the 14th day of June, 1985.
