The Statewide Misdemeanant Confinement Program (SMCP) manages the housing, transportation and medical expenses of state inmates housed in a local jail who have been convicted of a misdemeanor crime with a sentence of 91 days or more and those convicted of a misdemeanor Driving While Impaired (DWI) offense. The North Carolina Sheriffs' Association (NCSA) provides a critical role in managing the day-to-day operations of the program. The Monthly Status Report is prepared by NCSA staff and then sent to all interested parties. The report includes the daily inmate population for the reported month, the number of volunteered beds in the program, the number of confinements in response to violations (CRV's) for the month, the number of DWI's for the month, and the funds collected and expended year-to-date.

NCSA staff began teleworking on March 17th, 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. While our operations initially transitioned to working remotely, and then to a mixture of remote and limited in-office personnel, standard operating procedures have not been impacted. The NCSA staff has not encountered any issues which would impair its responsibility to manage the SMCP effectively.

NCSA staff continues to process entries into, and releases out of, the Statewide Misdemeanant Confinement Program. It should also be noted that the number of SMCP beds currently being utilized has stabilized over the past several months. However, when comparing current population data to periods before the pandemic, population numbers remain well below average. This decline is due to the limited number of cases currently being brought before the court in combination with the number of SMCP inmates that are being released upon the completion of their sentence.

All counties holding SMCP inmates continue to receive reimbursements for housing and transportation costs. The NCSA staff continues to ensure reimbursements are calculated appropriately through a monthly reconciliation process. All reimbursements for the month of February 2021 were issued to counties on a timely basis, according to policy, on March 31st, 2021.

Due to the uncertainty of COVID-19, several receiving counties have requested a temporary suspension of the assignment of additional inmates from other counties to their facilities. This reduction has not created any insurmountable impact on SMCP operations. NCSA staff are certain that these counties will begin to accept SMCP inmates at their previous levels after the pandemic has passed. The County map has been adjusted to differentiate between

receiving counties (those with an active SMCP contract), sending only counties, and receiving counties with a temporary suspension. The map can be found on page 10 of the Monthly Status Report.

A timeline outlining when counties suspended intake has been added to the monthly status report. This timeline will be updated with each monthly report to included additional counties suspending participation in the program, as well as the dates when counties return to normal operating procedures. The timeline can be found on page 11 of this report.

The total capacity of counties requesting a suspension on receiving new inmates is 369 beds: 291 male, 78 female, 0 youthful male, and 0 youthful females. Of these beds 150 were occupied as of March 31st, 2021: 127 males, 23 females, 0 youthful males, 0 youthful females. All inmates assigned to counties before the suspension will remain in their assigned counties until their sentences are completed.

The total capacity of counties still receiving new inmates is 999 beds: 808 males, 191 females, 0 youthful males, and 0 youthful females. Of these beds 435 were occupied as of March 31st, 2021: 372 males, 63 females, 0 youthful males, and 0 youthful females. Total available beds for new SMCP inmates as of March 31st, 2021 is 564 beds: 436 males, 128 females, 0 youthful males, 0 youthful females.

NCSA staff continues to evaluate and manage the operations of the program as we progress though this period of uncertainty. NCSA staff are constantly evaluating ways to evolve and expand the capacity of the program that are mutually acceptable among all stakeholders.


