April 2021

The Statewide Misdemeanant Confinement Program (SMCP) manages the housing, transportation and medical expenses of state inmates housed in a local jail who have been convicted of a misdemeanor crime with a sentence of 91 days or more and those convicted of a misdemeanor Driving While Impaired (DWI) offense. The North Carolina Sheriffs' Association (NCSA) provides a critical role in managing the day-to-day operations of the program. The Monthly Status Report is prepared by NCSA staff and then sent to all interested parties. The report includes the daily inmate population for the reported month, the number of volunteered beds in the program, the number of confinements in response to violations (CRV's) for the month, the number of DWI's for the month, and the funds collected and expended year-to-date.

NCSA staff began teleworking on March 17th, 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. While our operations initially transitioned to working remotely, and then to a mixture of remote and limited in-office personnel, standard operating procedures have not been impacted. NCSA staff plan to return to fully in-office operations beginning on May 3rd, 2021. During these transitions, the NCSA staff has not encountered any issues which would impair its responsibility to manage the SMCP effectively.

NCSA staff continues to process entries into, and releases out of, the Statewide Misdemeanant Confinement Program. It should also be noted that the number of SMCP beds being utilized experienced a downward trend at the start of the pandemic due to a limited number of cases being brought before the court and the release of SMCP inmates. The downward trend eventually stabilized and current numbers seem to indicate a gradual increase in population is occurring when examining the past several months. However, when comparing current population data to periods before the pandemic, population numbers remain well below average.

All counties holding SMCP inmates continue to receive reimbursements for housing and transportation costs. The NCSA staff continues to ensure reimbursements are calculated appropriately through a monthly reconciliation process. All reimbursements for the month of March 2021 were issued to counties on a timely basis, according to policy, on April 30th, 2021.

Due to the uncertainty of COVID-19, several receiving counties have requested a temporary suspension of the assignment of additional inmates from other counties to their facilities. The reduction caused by these suspensions has not created any insurmountable impact on SMCP operations. As time has passed, many of the counties requesting temporary suspension have once again begun to receive inmates from outside counties. NCSA staff are

certain counties will continue to lift suspensions and begin to accept SMCP inmates at their previous levels after the pandemic has passed. The County map has been adjusted to differentiate between receiving counties (those with an active SMCP contract), sending only counties, and receiving counties with a temporary suspension. The map can be found on page 10 of the Monthly Status Report.

A timeline outlining when counties suspended intake has been added to the monthly status report. This timeline will be updated with each monthly report to include additional counties suspending participation in the program, as well as the dates when counties return to normal operating procedures. The timeline can be found on page 11 of this report.

The total capacity of counties requesting a suspension on receiving new inmates is 319 beds: 241 male, 78 female, 0 youthful male, and 0 youthful females. Of these beds 146 were occupied as of April 30th, 2021: 125 males, 21 females, 0 youthful males, 0 youthful females. All inmates assigned to counties before the suspension will remain in their assigned counties until their sentences are completed.

The total capacity of counties still receiving new inmates is 1049 beds: 858 males, 191 females, 0 youthful males, and 0 youthful females. Of these beds 504 were occupied as of April 30th, 2021: 438 males, 66 females, 0 youthful males, and 0 youthful females. Total available beds for new SMCP inmates as of April 30th, 2021 is 545 beds: 420 males, 125 females, 0 youthful males, 0 youthful females.

NCSA staff continues to evaluate and manage the operations of the program as we progress through this period of uncertainty. NCSA staff are constantly evaluating ways to evolve and expand the capacity of the program that are mutually acceptable among all stakeholders.
