Statewide Misdemeanant Confinement Program

Monthly Status Report

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The Statewide Misdemeanant Confinement Program (SMCP) manages the housing, transportation and medical expenses of state inmates housed in a local jail who have been convicted of a misdemeanor crime with a sentence of 91 days or more and those convicted of a misdemeanor Driving While Impaired (DWI) offense. The North Carolina Sheriffs' Association (NCSA) provides a critical role in managing the day-to-day operations of the program. The Monthly Status Report is prepared by NCSA staff and then sent to all interested parties. The report includes the daily inmate population for the reported month, the number of volunteered beds in the program, the number of confinements in response to violations (CRV's) for the month, the number of DWI's for the month, and the funds collected and expended year-to-date.

Pursuant to G.S. § 148-32.1 (b2), Section 16C. (a): The North Carolina Sheriffs' Association must provide the monthly report on the status of the Statewide Misdemeanant Confinement Program to the Office of State Budget and Management and the Fiscal Research Division no later than the 15th day of each month. Previously, this requirement was contained within session law but is now housed within newly amended G.S. § 148-32(b2).

NCSA staff continues to process entries into, and releases out of, the Statewide Misdemeanant Confinement Program. It should also be noted that the number of SMCP beds being utilized experienced a downward trend at the start of the pandemic due limited a limited number of cases being brought before the court and the release of SMCP inmates. The downward trend eventually stabilized and current numbers seem to indicate a gradual increase in population is occurring when examining the past several months. However, when comparing current population data to periods before the pandemic, population numbers remain well below average.

All counties holding SMCP inmates continue to receive reimbursements for housing and transportation costs. The NCSA staff continues to ensure reimbursement are calculated appropriately through a monthly reconciliation process. All reimbursements for the month of October 2022 were issued to counties on a timely basis, according to policy, on November 30, 2022.

Due to COVID-19 and related staffing issues, 29 of those 70 receiving counties have requested a moratorium on the assignment of additional inmates from other counties to their facilities. As time has passed, many of the counties requesting temporary suspension have once again begun to receive inmates from outside counties. The reduction caused by these

suspensions has not created any insurmountable impact on SMCP operations. NCSA staff are certain counties will continue to lift suspensions and begin to accept SMCP inmates at their previous levels after the pandemic has passed. The County map has been adjusted to differentiate between receiving counties (those with an active SMCP contract), sending only counties, and receiving counties with a temporary suspension. The map can be found on page 8 of the Monthly Status Report.

In the 2021 Regular Session, the North Carolina General Assembly enacted Senate Bill 105 [S.L. 2021 – 180] – the 2021 Appropriations Act. This bill included a provision that increased the reimbursement rate from \$40 per day to \$60 per day for all SMCP inmates in those counties that utilize SMCP inmate labor to perform at least 500 work hours of roadway cleanup per month.

The below table reflects the number of counties using SMCP inmate labor for roadway cleanup who have participated for November 2022.

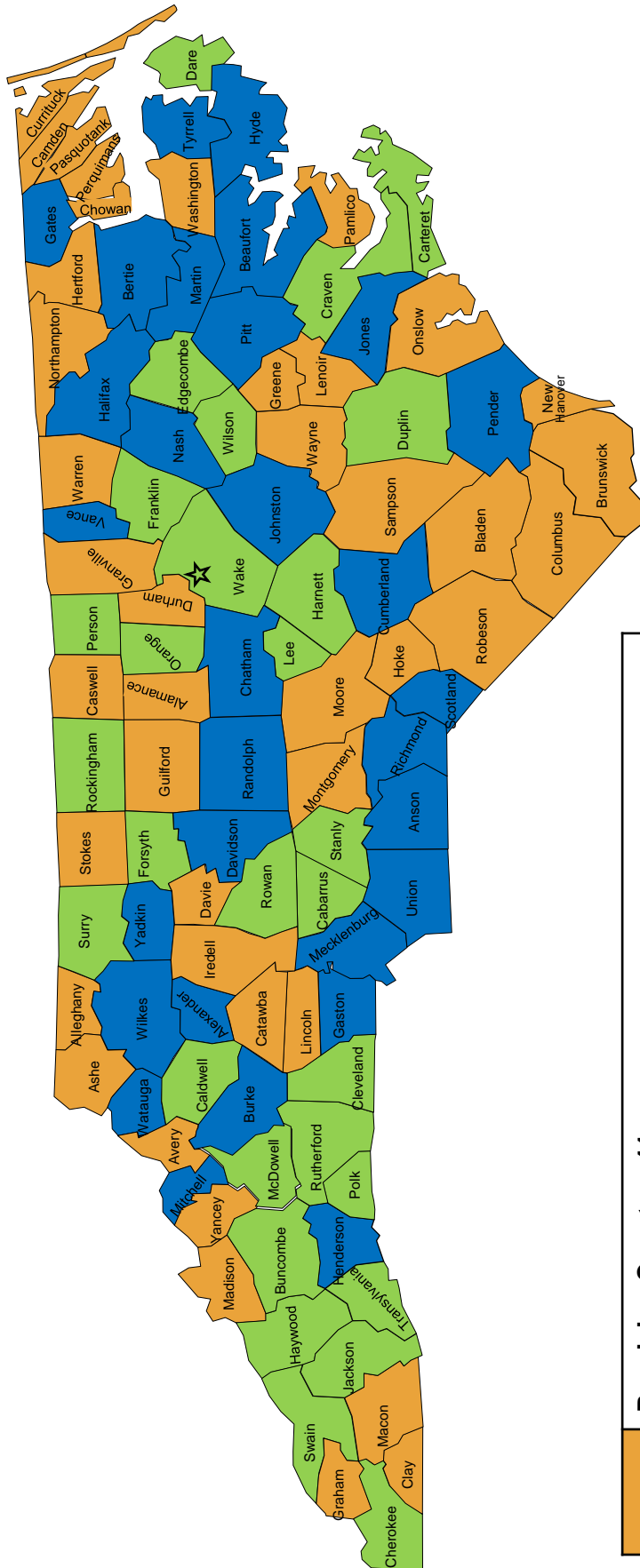
