



1 Section 1. Creation of commission. There is created a Commission on Travel  
2 and Tourism Reorganization.

3 Sec. 2. Membership. The Commission shall consist of 17 members:

- 4 (1) Three Senators appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate;
- 5 (2) Three Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of  
6 Representatives;
- 7 (3) One representative of the Department of Agriculture to be designated  
8 by the Commissioner of Agriculture;
- 9 (4) Two representatives of the Department of Commerce, one of whom  
10 shall be the Director of the Division of Travel and Tourism, serving ex  
11 officio, and one of whom shall be designated by the Secretary of  
12 Commerce;
- 13 (5) One representative of the Department of Cultural Resources  
14 designated by the Secretary of Cultural Resources;
- 15 (6) One representative of the Department of Natural Resources and  
16 Community Development designated by the Secretary of Natural  
17 Resources and Community Development;
- 18 (7) Two public members with knowledge, experience, and interest in the  
19 area of travel and tourism appointed by the Governor;
- 20 (8) Two public members with knowledge, experience, and interest in the  
21 area of travel and tourism appointed by the President Pro Tempore of  
22 the Senate; and
- 23 (9) Two public members with knowledge, experience, and interest in the  
24 area of travel and tourism appointed by the Speaker of the House of  
25 Representatives.

26 Sec. 3. Selection of cochairmen; vacancies. The President Pro Tempore of the  
27 Senate shall designate one Senator to serve as cochairman and the Speaker of the House  
28 of Representatives shall designate one Representative to serve as cochairman. Any  
29 vacancy that occurs on the Commission shall be filled in the same manner as the  
30 original appointment.

31 Sec. 4. Commission duties. The Commission shall examine the organization  
32 of State government as it relates to travel and tourism. The Commission shall make  
33 recommendations regarding the reorganization and consolidation of agencies of the  
34 State whose functions are strongly related to travel and tourism, including but not  
35 limited to: (i) Ways in which agencies may operate more efficiently and economically;  
36 (ii) Ways in which agencies can provide better services to the State and to the people;  
37 and (iii) Instances in which functions of agencies are duplicative, overlapping,  
38 incomplete in scope or coverage, fail to accomplish legislative objectives, or for any  
39 other reason should be redefined or redistributed.

40 Sec. 5. Reports; termination. The Commission shall submit a written report to  
41 the 1991 General Assembly upon its convening. The Commission shall terminate upon  
42 submitting its final report.

1           Sec. 6. Staffing. With the prior approval of the Legislative Services  
2 Commission, the Commission may obtain clerical and professional assistance from the  
3 Legislative Services Office.

4           Sec. 7. Meeting Place. With the prior approval of the Legislative Services  
5 Commission, the Commission shall meet in the State Legislative Building or in the  
6 Legislative Office Building.

7           Sec. 8. Members' reimbursement. Commission members shall be paid  
8 subsistence and travel allowances in accordance with the provisions of G.S. 120-3.1,  
9 138-5, and 138-6, as applicable.

10          Sec. 9. Funding. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the General  
11 Assembly the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) for fiscal year 1989-90 to  
12 fund the Commission authorized by this act.

13          Sec. 10. This act shall become effective July 1, 1989.
