#### A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- AN ACT TO SET CERTAIN LIMITATIONS ON THE ISSUANCE OF ALCOHOLIC
  BEVERAGE CONTROL PERMITS WHERE LOCAL ZONING ORDINANCES
- 4 HAVE BEEN ADOPTED.
- 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 Notice to Local Government. - Before issuing an ABC permit, for an "(b) establishment, the Commission shall give notice of the permit application to the 8 governing body of the city in which the establishment is located. If the establishment is 9 not inside a city, the Commission shall give notice to the governing body of the county. 10 The Commission shall allow the local governing body 10-30 days from the time the 11 notice was mailed or delivered to file written objection to the issuance of the permit. To 12 be considered by the Commission, the objection shall state the facts upon which it is 13 14 based."

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Sec. 2. G.S. 18B-901(c) reads as rewritten:

16 "(c) Factors in Issuing Permit. – Before issuing a permit, the Commission shall be 17 satisfied that the applicant is a suitable person to hold an ABC permit and that the 18 location is a suitable place to hold the permit for which he has applied. To be a suitable 19 place, the establishment shall comply with all applicable building and fire codes. Other 20 factors the Commission may-shall consider in determining whether the applicant and the 21 business location are suitable are:

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(1) The reputation, character, and criminal record of the applicant;

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Section 1. G.S. 18B-901(b) reads as rewritten:

11		business at that location would be detrimental to the neighborhood."
12	Sec. 2	3. This act is effective upon ratification and shall apply only to new
13	applications for	ABC permits filed on or after the ratification date.
