1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE NORTH CAROLINA REGISTER OF HISTORIC
3 PLACES.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 Section 1. Article 1 of Chapter 121 of the General Statutes is amended by
6 adding a new section to read:

7 "**§ 121-4.1. North Carolina Register of Historic Places.**

8 (a) The Department of Cultural Resources may establish, expand, and maintain a
9 North Carolina Register of Historic Places composed of districts, sites, buildings,
10 structures, and objects significant in North Carolina history, architecture, archaeology,
11 engineering, and culture. Until such time as the North Carolina Register of Historic
12 Places is established, all references to it in the General Statutes and in the rules adopted
13 pursuant to it shall be construed to mean properties and districts in North Carolina that
14 are listed in the National Register of Historic Places.

15 (b) The North Carolina Historical Commission shall establish criteria for
16 properties to be included in the State Register of Historic Places, and, within such
17 criteria, shall provide for levels of significance as necessary and appropriate.

18 (c) The North Carolina Historical Commission shall promulgate regulations
19 requiring that before any property or district may be included on the North Carolina
20 Register of Historic Places, the owner or owners of such property, or a majority of the
21 owners of the properties within the district in the case of an historic district, shall be
22 given the opportunity (including a reasonable period of time) to concur in, or object to,

1 the nomination of the property or district for such inclusion or designation. If the owner
2 or owners of any privately owned property, or a majority of the owners of such
3 properties within the district in the case of an historic district, object to such inclusion or
4 designation, such property shall not be included on the North Carolina Register until
5 such objection has been withdrawn. The regulations under this paragraph shall include
6 provisions to carry out the purposes of this paragraph in the case of multiple ownership
7 of a single property."

8 Sec. 2. This act shall become effective October 1, 1989.
