A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO REGULATE HOT DOG VENDORS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 130A-250 reads as rewritten:

"§ 130A-250. Exemptions; rules regulating bed and breakfast establishments.

This Part shall not apply to (i) facilities which provide food or lodging to regular boarders or permanent house guests only; (ii) private clubs; (iii) curb markets operated by the State Agricultural Extension Service; (iv) occasional fund-raising events conducted by the same person no more frequently than two consecutive days every three months; and (v) hot dog stands operated by nonprofit or volunteer associations. A food or drink stand operated for two weeks or less shall comply with the rules but shall not be subject to grading. A mobile food unit or pushcart shall comply with the rules and shall be operated in conjunction with a permitted restaurant but shall not be subject to grading.

This Part shall not apply to private homes offering bed and breakfast accommodations to eight or less persons per night until such time as the Health Services Commission adopts rules regulating them in accordance with this Part. The Commission is authorized and directed to adopt reasonable rules pursuant hereto to become effective no later than July 1, 1984."

Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
