AN ACT TO PROVIDE CERTAIN EMPLOYEE BENEFITS TO CLERKS AND SECRETARIES WHO HAVE BEEN EMPLOYED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY AT LEAST FOUR CONSECUTIVE YEARS.

Section 1. Chapter 120 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new Article to read:

"ARTICLE 22.

"BENEFITS FOR GENERAL ASSEMBLY CAREER EMPLOYEES.

"§ 120-190. Permanent career employee benefits.

- (a) A permanent career employee may not be transferred to a position with a lower salary unless the change in position is a demotion resulting from inefficiency in performance or from a disciplinary action for good cause.
- (b) A career employee may accumulate sick leave in the same manner as other employees of the General Assembly. Sick leave may be used for illness, or for injury which prevents an employee from performing his usual duties. Sick leave shall be transferred from a State agency after an employee transfers from a State agency and attains the necessary service at the General Assembly to be a career employee.
- (c) A career employee may have two days each two-year session for emergency leave. Emergency leave may be used for medical appointments, the illness of a member of the employee's immediate family, or the death of a member of the employee's immediate family.
 - (d) A career employee shall have the option of working during the interim.

- (e) As used in this Article 'career employee' means a clerk or secretary who has been employed by the General Assembly for at least four consecutive years.

- A temporary career employee shall receive, in addition to the salary increase provided by the General Assembly for all State employees, a five percent (5%) salary increase each year of service."
 - Sec. 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 1989.
