14 15 Section 1. G.S. 20-13.2(d) reads as rewritten:

"(d) A revocation under this section continues until the provisional licensee reaches 18 years of age or 45 days have elapsed, whichever occurs last. When a license is revoked pursuant to this section, the period of suspension shall be for six months. Revocations under this section run concurrently with any other revocations, but a limited driving privilege issued pursuant to law does not authorize a provisional licensee to drive if his license is revoked under this section."

Sec. 2. This act shall become effective October 1, 1989, and shall apply to any provisional licensee convicted of violating the provisions of G.S. 20-138.3 or an offense involving impaired driving on or after the effective date.
