A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE TO STUDY THE ADMINISTRATIVE RULES PERTAINING TO THE SUSPENSION OF ACCESS TO THE POLICE INFORMATION NETWORK.

Whereas, the Division of Criminal Information of the Department of Justice has published rules pertaining to the standards, agreements, and management control of the Police Information Network; and

Whereas, the rules provide that a local law enforcement agency's access to the Network may be suspended, on a first offense, for an unauthorized dissemination of criminal history information, including dissemination to another law enforcement agency; and

Whereas, the unauthorized dissemination may be the result of the simple negligence of a certified operator; and

Whereas, the suspension of a local government law enforcement agency's access to the Network may result in a decrease in the ability of law enforcement agencies to perform their duties and responsibilities to the public; Now, therefore,

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. The Department of Justice shall study the laws governing the State's contract for access to the Police Information Network, and its own rules, to determine whether a local government law enforcement agency's access to the Network must be suspended where information is erroneously transferred by one law enforcement agency to another law enforcement agency, or under any other circumstances, and whether its internal rules defining violations and applicable penalties

Sec. 2. The Department of Justice shall make a written report of its findings to the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations at least one month prior to the 1990 Session of the 1989 General Assembly.

Sec. 3. This act is effective upon ratification.
