A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO FUND A PILOT PROGRAM AT SUMMIT HOUSE, A COMMUNITY-BASED ALTERNATIVE TO INCARCERATION FOR MOTHERS AND PREGNANT WOMEN.

Whereas, Summit House, located in Guilford County, is a nonprofit organization whose purpose is to provide a community-based residential alternative to prison for mothers and pregnant women who have been convicted of nonviolent crimes; and

Whereas, Summit House offers an alternative to the incarceration of a mother or pregnant woman and the placement of her children in foster care; and

Whereas, Summit House prevents such family breakups by allowing children to remain with their mothers in a residential setting while their mothers satisfy their obligations to the criminal justice system; and

Whereas, Summit House has a structured program that provides close supervision and a treatment approach that includes group and individual counseling, classes in daily living, family counseling, and substance abuse treatment; and

Whereas, the program provides instruction in the areas of parenting, good health, addiction, family relationships, self-management, housing, education, employment, and social skills; Now, therefore,

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Correction \$75,000 for the 1989-90 for a pilot program at Summit House, a community-based residential alternative to incarceration for mothers and pregnant women convicted of non-violent crimes.

- Sec. 2. The Department of Correction shall monitor the pilot program and shall provide an evaluation of its effectiveness to the General Assembly on or before May 1, 1990.
- 4 Sec. 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 1989.
