1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO PROVIDE ASSISTANCE TO REGIONAL
3	HISTORIC ATTRACTIONS.
4	Whereas, North Carolina is blessed with numerous historical resources which
5	enrich the lives of its citizens and attract the interest of tourists; and
6	Whereas, the General Assembly has augmented the development of many
7	historic attractions in the State; and
8	Whereas, many local communities operate various regional historic
9	attractions largely through resources raised within those communities; and
10	Whereas, the North Carolina Historical Commission has recommended
11	slowing the acquisition of State Historic Sites and instead providing greater technical,
12	professional, and financial assistance to regional historic attractions; and
13	Whereas, the North Carolina Historical Commission has adopted procedures
14	and methods for the proper and equitable distribution of grants funds to regional historic
15	attractions throughout the State; Now, therefore,
16	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
17	Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
18	Cultural Resources the sum of \$250,000 for the 1989-90 fiscal year and the sum of
19	\$250,000 for the 1990-91 fiscal year grants of up to twenty-five thousand dollars
20	(\$25,000) to nonprofit historic attractions in North Carolina for use for operating
21	expenses and other purposes, all as approved by the North Carolina Historical
22	Commission, provided that any grant recipient agrees to match the State grant on a
23	dollar-for-dollar basis, and provided that ten percent (10%) of the grant and its match be

placed in a restricted trust for the long-term operation and preservation of the historic
 attraction, and provided that the expenditure and accounting of these grant funds by the
 historic attraction adhere to reasonable rules and regulations established by the North
 Carolina Historical Commission.
 Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
 Cultural Resources the sum of \$37,500 for the 1989-90 fiscal year and the sum of

\$37,500 for the 1990-91 fiscal year to provide additional technical and consultative
services to historic attractions receiving State grants and to administer the regional

- Sec. 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 1989.
