A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO REMOVE THE OBSOLETE SALES TAX EXEMPTION FOR ICE AND
TO ESTABLISH THE VIETNAM VETERANS MEMORIAL PARK
MAINTENANCE FUND.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 105-164.13(6) is repealed.

Sec. 2. G.S. 136-44 reads as rewritten:

"§ 136-44. Maintenance of grounds at home of Nathaniel Macon and grave of Anne Carter Lee certain sites.

(a) ~~The Department of Transportation is hereby authorized and directed through the highway supervisor of the Warren County District, to clean off and keep clean the premises and grounds at the old home of Nathaniel Macon, known as "Buck Springs," which are owned by the County of Warren, and also to look after the care and keeping the grounds surrounding the grave of Miss Anne Carter Lee, daughter of General Robert E. Lee, in Warren County. shall maintain the grounds at the following sites:~~

(1) The home of Nathaniel Macon, known as 'Buck Springs,' in Warren County.

(2) The grave of Miss Anne Carter Lee, daughter of General Robert E. Lee, in Warren County.

(3) The Vietnam Veterans Memorial Park, located off Interstate 85.

(b) A special endowment account, designated the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Park Maintenance Fund, is established in the State treasury. During fiscal year 1990-91, the Treasurer shall deposit the sum of two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) in the

1 Fund by transferring one-fourth of this amount at the end of each quarter in the fiscal
2 year. The amount of two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) represents part of the
3 estimated increase in State revenue generated by the removal of the sales tax exemption
4 for ice.

5 Each year, beginning with fiscal year 1991-92, income generated by the Fund is
6 annually appropriated to the Department of Transportation to maintain the grounds at
7 the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Park, located off Interstate 85. Income from the Fund
8 that is not needed in a fiscal year to maintain the Park grounds shall be added to the
9 principal in the Fund."

10 Sec. 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 1990.
