1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO SAVE STATE FUNDS BY CHANGING THE RULES REGARDING
3	REST HOME STAFFING.
4	Whereas, currently, the rules of the Social Services Commission require that,
5	unlike any other service providers, rest homes must staff according to license rather than
6	census; and
7	Whereas, this requirement means that rest homes are required to staff empty
8	beds; and
9	Whereas, currently, there is a twelve percent (12%) vacancy rate statewide in
10	rest homes; and
11	Whereas, to staff these unoccupied beds as is required by the current rules
12	costs the industry approximately four million dollars (\$4,000,000) based on minimum
13	wage; and
14	Whereas, as State reimbursement rate increases are approved based on costs
15	received for operations, without a rule change, the State will have to increase
16	appropriations to increase rate reimbursement to cover the costs of staffing these empty
17	beds; Now, therefore,
18	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
19	Section 1. Effective October 1, 1990, the Social Services Commission shall
20	change its rule regarding rest homes staffing to a rule that requires staffing based on
21	annual residency census.
22	Sec. 2. This act shall become effective October 1, 1990.
