A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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AN ACT REGARDING YEAR-ROUND EDUCATION.

Whereas, with the year 2000 fast approaching, it is reasonable to question whether a school calendar designed for the agricultural economy of the 1800s is appropriate for today's schools; and

Whereas, the three-month interruption of formal instruction may no longer be justifiable; and

Whereas, proponents of year-round education argue convincingly that continuous instruction is better instruction; and

Whereas, providing more time designed around a better framework can improve retention and reduce memory loss; and

Whereas, year-round education is proving itself in California, Utah, and Nevada; and

Whereas, more and more school districts in Virginia and Florida are seriously studying year-round education and are planning for implementation of it; Now, therefore,
