Referred to:  June 6, 1990  A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA INCURS NO LIABILITY BECAUSE OF ACTIONS OF BOARDS OF TRUSTEES OF FIREMEN'S RELIEF FUNDS.  The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:  Section 1. G.S. 58-84-35 reads as rewritten:  "\$ 58-84-35. Disbursement of funds by trustees.  The board of trustees shall have entire control of the funds derived from the provisions of this Article, and shall disburse the funds only for the following purposes:  (1) To safeguard any fireman in active service from financial loss, occasioned by sickness contracted or injury received while in the performance of his duties as a fireman.  (2) To provide a reasonable support for those actually dependent upon the services of any fireman who may lose his life in the fire service of his town, city, or State, either by accident or from disease contracted or injury received by reason of such service. The amount is to be determined according to the earning capacity of the deceased. **(4)** To provide for the payment of any fireman's assessment in the 1 2 Firemen's Fraternal Insurance Fund of the State of North Carolina 3 if the board of trustees finds as a fact that said fireman is unable to pay the said assessment by reason of disability. 4 5 (5) To provide for benefits of supplemental retirement, workers 6 compensation, and other insurance and pension protection for 7 firemen otherwise qualifying for benefits from the Firemen's Relief Fund as set forth in Article 85 of this Chapter. 8 9 (6) To provide for educational benefits to firemen and their 10 dependents who otherwise qualify for benefits from the Firemen's 11 Relief Fund as set forth in Article 85 of this Chapter.

Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, no expenditures shall be made pursuant to subsections (5) and (6) of this section unless the State Firemen's Association has certified that such expenditures will not render the Fund actuarially unsound for the purposes of providing the benefits set forth in subsections (1), (2), and (4) of this section. If, for any reason, funds made available for subsections (5) and (6) of this section shall be insufficient to pay in full any benefits, the benefits pursuant to subsections (5) and (6) shall be reduced pro rata for as long as the amount of insufficient funds exists. No claim shall accrue with respect to any amount by which a benefit under subsections (5) and (6) shall have been reduced.

The State of North Carolina is not liable under this Article or any local modification thereof because of any action of a board of trustees."

Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.

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
