

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED			
AN ACT TO ALLOW MEMBERS OF THE TEACHERS' AND STATE			
EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM AND OF THE LOCAL			
GOVERNMENTAL EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM TO RETIRE WITH			
UNREDUCED BENEFITS AFTER COMPLETING TWENTY-FIVE YEARS OF SERVICE.			
The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
Section 1. G.S. 135-5(b11) reads as rewritten:			
"(b11) Service Retirement Allowance of Members Retiring on or after July 1,			
1989.1989, but before July 1, 1990. – Upon retirement from service in accordance with			
subsection (a) above, on or after July 1, 1989, but before July 1, 1990, a member shall			
receive the following service retirement allowance:			
(1) A member who is a law enforcement officer or an eligible former law			
enforcement officer shall receive a service retirement allowance			
computed as follows: a. If the member's service retirement date occurs on or after his			
55th birthday, and completion of five years of creditable service			
as a law enforcement officer, or after the completion of 30 years			
of creditable service, the allowance shall be equal to one and			
sixty-three hundredths percent (1.63%) of his average final			
compensation, multiplied by the number of years of his			

creditable service.



- - "(b11) Service Retirement Allowance of Members Retiring on or after July 1, 1989.1989, but before July 1, 1990. Upon retirement from service in accordance with subsection (a) above, on or after July 1, 1989, but before July 1, 1990, a member shall receive the following service retirement allowance:
 - (1) A member who is a law enforcement officer or an eligible former law enforcement officer shall receive a service retirement allowance computed as follows:
 - If the member's service retirement date occurs on or after his 55th birthday, and completion of five years of creditable service as a law enforcement officer, or after the completion of 30 years of creditable service, the allowance shall be equal to one and sixty-three hundredths percent (1.63%) of his average final compensation, multiplied by the number of years of his creditable service.
 - b. This allowance shall also be governed by the provisions of G.S. 128-27(b8)(2).
 - (2) A member who is not a law enforcement officer or an eligible former law enforcement officer shall receive a service retirement allowance computed as follows:
 - a. If the member's service retirement date occurs on or after his 65th birthday upon the completion of five years of creditable service or after the completion of 30 years of creditable service or on or after his 60th birthday upon the completion of 25 years of creditable service, the allowance shall be equal to one and sixty-three hundredths percent (1.63%) of his average final compensation, multiplied by the number of years of creditable service.
 - b. This allowance shall also be governed by the provisions of G.S. 128-27(b7)(2a) and (3)."
 - Sec. 4. G.S. 128-27 is amended by adding a new section to read:
 - "(b12) Service Retirement Allowance of Members Retiring on or after July 1, 1990. Upon retirement from service in accordance with subsection (a) above, on or after July 1, 1990, a member shall receive the following service retirement allowance:
 - (1) A member who is a law enforcement officer or an eligible former law enforcement officer shall receive a service retirement allowance computed as follows:
 - a. If the member's service retirement date occurs on or after his 55th birthday, and completion of five years of creditable service as a law enforcement officer, or after the completion of 25 years of creditable service, the allowance shall be equal to one and sixty-three hundredths percent (1.63%) of his average final compensation, multiplied by the number of years of his creditable service.
