27	Office an annual compliance plan which outlines the agency's minority, small, female,
28	and handicapped-owned business contracting goals for the fiscal year, the manner in
29	which the agency intends to reach these goals, and a timetable for reaching these goals.
30	The Disadvantaged Business Development Office shall review and approve the plan of
31	each agency or reject any plan that does not comply with the provisions of this Part or
32	any rules adopted pursuant to this Part.
33	(b) The compliance plan shall include a policy statement signed by the agency
34	head, expressing a commitment to use minority, small, female, and handicapped-owned
35	businesses in all aspects of contracting to the maximum extent feasible.

37	(a) When a State agency determines that a business has knowingly supplied false
38	information in order to be classified as a minority, small, female, or handicapped-owned
39	business, the State agency shall contact the Director of the Disadvantaged Business
40	Development Office to determine, after consultation with legal counsel, the appropriate
41	action to be taken.
42	(b) Prior to any final determination under subsection (a) of this section, the
43	business charged with supplying false information may commence an action under
44	Chapter 150B of the General Statutes.

1	(c) Any person who, with intent to defraud another, represents himself as a
2	minority, small, female, or handicapped-owned business for the purpose of obtaining
3	money, goods, property, services, choses in action, or any item of value from a person
4	within this State is guilty of a Class J felony."
5	Sec. 2. G.S. 120-123 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:

7	by Part 29 of Article 9 of Chapter 143B of the General Statutes."
8	Sec. 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
9	Administration the sum of \$100,000 for fiscal year 1989-90 and \$100,000 for fiscal year
10	1990-91 for the creation of the Disadvantaged Business Development Office and for the
11	implementation of the provisions of this act.
12	Sec. 4. Section 3 of this act shall become effective July 1, 1989. Sections 1
10	

13 and 2 of this act shall become effective January 1, 1990.
