A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO CONTINUE THE BIRTH-RELATED NEUROLOGICAL
2 IMPAIRMENT STUDY COMMISSION AND PROVIDE THAT FUNDS
3 PREVIOUSLY APPROPRIATED TO THE COMMISSION SHALL REMAIN
4 AVAILABLE.
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6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 Section 1. The Birth-Related Neurological Impairment Study Commission,
8 created by Section 6.1 of Chapter 1100 of the 1987 Session Laws, shall continue in
9 existence until the **sine die** adjournment of the 1989 Regular Session. The Commission
10 may report to the 1989 General Assembly during its Regular Session in 1989 and if not,
11 then it shall report on the first day the Regular Session meets in 1990, provided that if
12 the 1989 Regular Session does not meet in 1990, the Commission is continued until the
13 convening of the 1991 Regular Session and shall report by that date.

14 Sec. 2. The continued Birth-Related Neurological Impairment Study
15 Commission shall have the powers and duties of the original Study Commission as they
16 are necessary to continue the original study, and to plan further activity on the subject of
17 the study.

18 Sec. 3. Members and staff of the continued Birth-Related Neurological
19 Impairment Study Commission shall receive compensation and expenses as under the
20 original authorization in Chapter 1100 of the 1987 Session Laws.

21 Sec. 4. The members of the Birth-Related Neurological Impairment Study
22 Commission shall be those members originally appointed to the Commission.

23 Sec. 5. Unexpended funds appropriated to the Birth-Related Neurological
24 Impairment Study Commission by the 1987 General Assembly shall remain available to

1 fund the continued Birth-Related Neurological Impairment Study Commission.
2 Nothing in this act shall be construed to obligate the 1989 General Assembly to make
3 additional appropriations to the Birth-Related Neurological Impairment Study
4 Commission.

5 Sec. 6. This act is effective upon ratification.
