AN ACT TO CREATE THE SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT COMMISSION.			
The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
Section 1. Article 9 of Chapter 130A of the General Statutes is amended by			
adding a new Part to read:			
"PART 2A. SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT COMMISSION.			
"§ 130A-309.1. Legislative findings; purpose.			
The General Assembly finds that:			
<u>(1)</u>	North Carolina confronts a crisis in solid waste management due to the		
	shortage of landfill space, the stricter federal regulations that are		
	drastically more expensive to implement, and the present knowledge		
	that landfills threaten the groundwater of this State;		
<u>(2)</u>	More effective and responsive management of solid waste is necessary		
	to protect the public health and safety, to protect the environment, and		
	to protect the long term economic well-being of the State;		
<u>(3)</u>	The interests of the State are inextricably connected to the proper		
	voluntary management of solid waste by the units of local government.		
	It is in the best interests of the State and its citizens to develop long-		
	term State policies and programs;		
<u>(4)</u>	It should be the policy of the State to promote methods of solid waste		
	management that are alternatives to disposal in landfills and to assist		
	units of local government with solid waste management; and		
<u>(5)</u>	The State should assume a leadership role in the area of		
	comprehensive solid waste management.

3		government, State agencies, the private sector, and the general public;	
4	<u>(2)</u>	Confront the present and future problems of solid waste management

9	(a) The S	Solid Waste Management Commission is created. The composition of

11	<u>(1)</u>	Two members from State government: the State Health Director and

13		Department of Natural Resources and Community Development,	
14		serving ex officio as voting members;	
15	<u>(2)</u>	Two members of the General Assembly: one Senator appointed by the

18		their demonstrated concern in the area of solid waste management;	
19	<u>(3)</u>	Four representatives of local government: two appointed by the

diem and travel expenses as set forth in G.S. 138-5.

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(e) A majority of the Commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

"§ 130A-309.3. Powers and duties of the Commission.

- (a) The Solid Waste Management Commission shall:
 - (1) Develop a comprehensive solid waste management plan that is designed to address solid waste management in North Carolina for the next 20 years, that will protect the air and water quality of the State, that will distribute the burdens of such a plan in an equitable manner, taking all interests into account;
 - (2) Hire a nationally renowned consultant in the area of solid waste management who has demonstrated an ability to develop a long-range solid waste management plan on a statewide basis and to develop legislation to implement such a solid waste management plan; and
 - (3) Submit a final report of its findings, the 20-year solid waste management plan, and any recommended legislation to the General Assembly on or before the first day of the next session of the General Assembly after the plan has been finalized, but no later than March 1, 1993, by filing the report with the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. Upon filing its final report, the Commission shall terminate.
- (b) The Commission, while in the discharge of official duties, may exercise all the powers provided for under the provisions of G.S. 120-19, and G.S. 120-19.1 through G.S. 120-19.4. The Commission shall meet at least once every two months upon the joint call of the cochairmen. The Commission may meet in the Legislative Building or the Legislative Office Building.
- (c) The Commission may contract for professional, clerical, or consultant services as provided by G.S. 120-32.02. The Legislative Services Commission, through the Legislative Administrative Officer, shall assign professional staff to assist in the work of the Commission. The House of Representatives and the Senate's Supervisor of Clerks shall assign clerical staff to the Commission, upon the direction of the Legislative Services Commission. The expenses relating to clerical employees shall be borne by the Commission."
- Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the General Assembly the sum of \$75,000 for the 1989-90 fiscal year and the sum of \$75,000 for the 1990-91 fiscal year for the expenses of the Solid Waste Management Commission.
 - Sec. 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 1989.
