A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 AN ACT TO PROHIBIT INTRODUCTION OF TOXIC SUBSTANCES INTO 3 PRIMARY NURSERY AREAS.
- Whereas, the waters of the South River and North River in Carteret County and the waters of Core Sound, Bogue Sound, Back Sound, the Newport River, Calico Creek, Core Creek, Adams Creek, and the Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway connecting Adams Creek and Back Sound provide vital nursery areas for the early development of commercially important species of finfish and shellfish and particularly shrimp;
- 9 Whereas, the continued productivity of these waters is threatened by the 10 introduction of toxic substances from drainage ditches and other conveyances that drain 11 large land areas; Now, therefore,
- 12 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
- 13 Section 1. Chapter 113 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new14 section to read:

15 "<u>§ 113-265.1. Introducing toxic substances into primary nursery areas.</u>

16 (a) It shall be unlawful for any corporation to allow any ditch or similar 17 conveyance within its control that, alone or in combination with any other ditch or 18 similar conveyance, drains a land area of greater than 4,000 acres owned by the 19 corporation, to discharge or otherwise introduce toxic substances into primary nursery 20 areas as designated by the Marine Fisheries Commission during the active nursery 21 season for juvenile species development in the following waters: the South River and 22 North River in Carteret County, Core Sound, Bogue Sound, Back Sound, the Newport

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1	River, Calico Creek, Core Creek, Adams Creek, and the Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway
2	connecting Adams Creek and Back Sound.
3	(b) For purposes of this act, 'toxic substances' shall mean the man-made or man-
4	induced alteration of the chemical, physical, biological, or radiological integrity of the
5	waters of the State, which results in the death of, or damage to, juvenile species. This
6	definition includes, but is not limited to, alterations resulting from an increase in natural
7	pollutants caused by man-related activities which result in death or damage to juvenile
8	species.
9	(c) <u>The Department shall provide adequate notice to affected corporations at least</u>
10	10 days prior to the beginning of the nursery season and shall promptly notify such
11	corporations of the close of the active nursery season.
12	(d) Any corporation violating the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a
13	misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not more than four thousand dollars
14	(\$4,000), or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both. Each day that a
15	violation continues after notice by the Department to cease shall constitute a separate
16	offense. A notice to cease shall be served personally or by certified mail."
17	Sec. 2. This act shall not be construed to obligate the General Assembly to
18	make any appropriation to implement the provisions of this act.
19	Sec. 3. This act is effective upon ratification.

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
