A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO ALLOW LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS WHO ARE MEMBERS

OF THE TEACHERS' AND STATE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM OR

THE LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM TO

RETIRE WITH UNREDUCED BENEFITS AFTER COMPLETING TWENTY
FIVE YEARS OF SERVICE.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 135-5(b11) reads as rewritten:

"(b11) Service Retirement Allowance of Members Retiring on or after July 1, 1989.1989, but before July 1, 1990. – Upon retirement from service in accordance with subsection (a) above, on or after July 1, 1989, but before July 1, 1990, a member shall receive the following service retirement allowance:
