A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO COMPLETE RENOVATION OF THE CHEATHAM BUILDING, OLD ADMINISTRATION BUILDING, AND OTHER SIGNIFICANT HISTORICAL LANDMARKS THAT COMPRISE THE CAMPUS OF THE CENTRAL CHILDREN'S HOME, INC.

Whereas, the Central Children's Home of North Carolina continues to provide residential care services for many of North Carolina's less fortunate children who are neglected, dependent, or orphaned, regardless of their race, creed, or color; and

Whereas, the Board of Directors continue to diligently improve the residential environment for the children currently living at the Central Children's home by spending thousands of dollars via private funding resources to maintain the up-keep of its physical plant operations; and

Whereas, the Cheatham Building and other historical landmarks which comprise the campus of the Central Children's Home were recently nominated for the National Register of Historic Places; and

Whereas, it is in the best interest of all citizens of North Carolina to protect and preserve its historical places and landmarks; Now, therefore,

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Cultural Resources, Division of Archives and History, the sum of one hundred twentynine thousand seven hundred thirty dollars (\$129,730) for the 1989-90 fiscal year to complete the renovation of the Cheatham Building, Old Administration Building, and other significant historical landmarks that comprise the campus of the Central Children's Home, Inc., in Oxford.

1 Sec. 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 1989.
