Section 1. Effective September 1, 1989, G.S. 7A-133 reads as rewritten:

"§ 7A-133. Numbers of judges by districts; numbers of magistrates and additional seats of court, by counties.

Each district court district shall have the numbers of judges and each county within the district shall have the numbers of magistrates and additional seats of court, as set forth in the following table:

Sec. 2. (a) Effective September 1, 1989, Nicholas Long and Harold P. McCoy, or their successors, shall be district court judges for district court district 6A. Effective September 1, 1989, Robert E. Williford, or his successors, shall be district court judge for district court district 6B.

(b) The additional District Court Judge authorized for district court district 6B by Section 1 of this act shall be appointed by the Governor for a term beginning September 1, 1989, and expiring the first Monday in December of 1990. A successor shall be elected in the 1990 general election for a four-year term.

Sec. 3. This act shall become effective September 1, 1989.
