A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO ADD A NEW JUDGE IN DISTRICT COURT DISTRICT 9.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. Effective September 1, 1989, G.S. 7A-133 reads as rewritten:

"§ 7A-133. Numbers of judges by districts; numbers of magistrates and additional seats of court, by counties.

Each district court district shall have the numbers of judges and each county within the district shall have the numbers of magistrates and additional seats of court, as set forth in the following table:

23 Sec. 2. The additional District Court Judge authorized for district court
 24 district 9 by Section 1 of this act shall be appointed by the Governor for a term
 25 beginning September 1, 1989, and expiring the first Monday in December of 1990. A
 26 successor shall be elected in the 1990 general election for a four-year term.

27 Sec. 3. This act shall become effective September 1, 1989.
