9	(a) <u>Electrolysis shall be practiced by a licensed person only in a permanent</u>
10	establishment, hereafter referred to as an office. The Board may adopt reasonable rules
11	and regulations concerning the sanitation standards, equipment, and supplies to be used
12	and observed in offices. Offices shall be subject to periodic inspection at any time
13	during business hours by members of the Board or its agents or assistants.
14	(b) Every electrologist shall notify the Board in writing 30 business days prior to,
15	but no later than 10 business days after, any change of address or opening of a new

17	(c) <u>Every electrologist shall display his license in a conspicuous place in the</u>

7	demonstrating adequate school facilities to accommodate students for
8	purposes of lectures, classroom instruction, and practical
9	demonstration;
10	(3) Submit a detailed list of the equipment to be used by the students in
11	the practical course of their studies;
12	(4) Submit a copy of the planned electrology curriculum consisting of the
13	number of hours and subject matter determined by the Board, provided
14	that the number of hours required shall not be less than 120 hours and
15	not more than 600 hours;
16	(5) Submit a certified copy of the school manual of instruction;
17	(6) Submit the names and qualifications of the instructors certified in
18	accordance with G.S. 88A-16; and,
19	(7) <u>Any additional information the Board may require.</u>
20	(b) When the Board determines that an applicant has met all the qualifications for
21	certification as a Board approved school of electrology, and has submitted the required
22	fee, the Board shall issue a certificate to the applicant.
23	(c) <u>A school's certification is only valid for the location named in the application.</u>
24	When a school desires to change locations, an application shall be submitted to the
25	Board on a form furnished by the Board and the fee shall be paid for certificate renewal.
26	(d) <u>A school's certification is not transferrable</u> . Schools must immediately notify the Board in writing of any sole, transfer, or alonge in ownership or management

28 29	(e) <u>Every school shall display its certification in a manner prescribed by the</u>
