Description of Legislation

- Summary of Legislation This bill is identical to SB 184 which has already passed second and third readings in the Senate and is in the House State Government Sub-Committee. This bill states that previous work done by a contractor on state projects will be used as a factor in awarding bids. The State Building Commission makes the final selection on the award of contracts and this evaluation will add no additional cost to the State Construction Office's budget. This was a bill strongly recommended by the State Property Study Committee.
