1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT TO DIVIDE DISTRICT COURT DISTRICT 3 INTO DISTRICTS 3A AND
3 3B CONSISTENT WITH THE BOUNDARIES ESTABLISHED FOR SUPERIOR
4 COURT AND PROSECUTORIAL DISTRICTS 3A AND 3B.

5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 Section 1. Effective September 1, 1991, G.S. 7A-133 reads as rewritten:

7 "§ 7A-133. Numbers of judges by districts; numbers of magistrates and additional
8 seats of court, by counties.

9 Each district court district shall have the numbers of judges and each county within
10 the district shall have the numbers of magistrates and additional seats of court, as set
11 forth in the following table:

24 Sec. 2. Effective September 1, 1991, David Leech, E. Burt Aycock, and
 25 James E. Martin, or their successors, shall be district court judges for district court
 26 district 3A. Effective September 1, 1991, George Wainright, James Ragan, W. Lee
 27 Lumpkin, and H. Horton Roundtree, or their successors, shall be district court judges for
 28 district court district 3B.

29 Sec. 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Judicial
 30 Department the sum of \$150,376 for the 1991-92 fiscal year and the sum of \$130,751
 31 for the 1992-93 fiscal year to implement this act.

32 Sec. 4. This act becomes effective September 1, 1991.
