A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE LEGISLATIVE RESEARCH COMMISSION TO STUDY THE NEED TO ESTABLISH A COLLEGE OF CHIROPRACTIC IN NORTH CAROLINA.  The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
Section 1. The Legislative Research Commission may study:  (1) The need and feasibility of establishing a college of chiropractic in this State; and
(2) If a chiropractic college is found needed and its establishment feasible, the best method of accomplishing that end, including the most advantageous and economical placement of such a college within The University of North Carolina System.
The University of North Carolina and its Board of Governors shall cooperate fully with this study if the Legislative Research Commission undertakes it.  Sec. 2. The Legislative Research Commission, if it undertakes the study outlined in Section 1 of this act, may report its findings and recommendations to the

Sec. 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislative

Research Commission the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the

1992-93 fiscal year to conduct the study authorized by this act. Sec. 4. This act is effective upon ratification.
