1 A HOUSE RESOLUTION URGING THE BUSINESS COMMUNITY IN NORTH
2 CAROLINA TO RECOGNIZE THE IMPORTANT ROLE COMMUNITY
3 CHAMBERS OF COMMERCE PLAY IN NORTH CAROLINA.

4 Whereas, there are more than 120 Chambers of Commerce in North Carolina,
5 serving communities as large as Charlotte and as small as Beech Mountain; and

6 Whereas, North Carolina's community Chambers of Commerce act as
7 catalysts for positive change; and

8 Whereas, each Chamber of Commerce directs its collective resources to
9 essential programs such as education, business training, leadership, military relations,
10 tourism, and a variety of other community and economic development pursuits; and

11 Whereas, Chambers of Commerce advance the general welfare and prosperity
12 of North Carolina's business community and all of its citizens; and

13 Whereas, Chambers of Commerce rely exclusively on the talents, energies,
14 and resources of volunteers to conduct their respective program; and

15 Whereas, North Carolina's economy and quality of life depend on the
16 individual contributions of its community Chambers of Commerce; and

17 Whereas, Chambers of Commerce are an irreplaceable component of North
18 Carolina's economy and continued well-being and would cease to exist without the
19 broad-based support of their respective business communities;

20 Now, therefore, be it resolved by the House of Representatives:

21 Section 1. The North Carolina House of Representatives urges all businesses
22 to recognize the many contributions and vast importance of community Chambers of

1 Commerce, and urges all businesses to invest in the Chambers of Commerce in
2 communities in which they conduct business.

3 Sec. 2. The Principal Clerk shall transmit a copy of this resolution to the 120
4 Chambers of Commerce in North Carolina.

5 Sec. 3. This resolution is effective upon adoption.
