(2)	Develop a plan for the establishment of a statewide system for assessing health status and health needs in every county. In determining community health status and needs, the Department shall solicit and consider input from private providers, community groups and agencies, the general public, and policy makers.
(3)	Plan for the development and implementation of a computerized statewide data collection and retrieval system that will permit comparisons of health data and indices, and that will enable local health departments to have access to data collected. In developing the

plan the Department shall consider recommendations in the 1989-90

Public Health Study Commission's final report pertaining to

standardization, adaptability, and costs of integrating local data

collection systems with the State system.

- The Commission for Health Services is created with the authority and duty to adopt rules to protect and promote the public health.
- The Commission is authorized to adopt rules necessary to implement the (b) public health programs administered by the Department as provided in this Chapter.
 - The Commission shall adopt rules: (c)

 - **(2)** Establishing standards for approving sewage-treatment devices and holding tanks for marine toilets as provided in G.S. 75A-6(o);
 - Establishing specifications for sanitary privies for schools where (3) water-carried sewage facilities are unavailable as provided in G.S. 115C-522;
 - **(4)** Establishing requirements for the sanitation of local confinement facilities as provided in Part 2 of Article 10 of Chapter 153A of the General Statutes; and
 - Repealed by Session Laws 1989 (Regular Session, 1990), c. 1075, s. 1, (5) effective July 28, 1990.
 - Requiring proper treatment and disposal of sewage and other waste (6) from chemical and portable toilets: toilets; and
