- 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
 - Section 1. G.S. 7A-517(21) reads as rewritten:

7 "(21) Neglected Juvenile. – A juvenile who does not receive proper care, supervision, or discipline from his parent, guardian, custodian, or caretaker; or who has 8 been abandoned; or who is not provided necessary medical care or other remedial care 9 recognized under State law, law; or who lives in an environment injurious to his 10 welfare, welfare; or who has been placed for care or adoption in violation of law, law; or 11 12 any newborn infant whose body is shown through test to contain any amount of a controlled substance as defined in Article 5, Chapter 90, of the General Statutes, or a 13 14 metabolite of such controlled substance, unless the presence of the controlled substance or the metabolite thereof is the result of medical treatment administered to the mother or 15 the newborn infant; or any newborn infant who suffers from fetal alcohol syndrome or 16 17 exhibits other physiological or neurological symptoms of drug or alcohol abuse by its mother; the results of the test shall not be admissible in any criminal proceeding." 18 19

Sec. 2. This act becomes effective October 1, 1991.
