A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE COLUMBUS COUNTY TO COLLECT SOLID WASTE
2 FEES IN THE SAME MANNER AS AD VALOREM TAXES AND, IN THE
3 CASE OF NONPAYMENT, TO IMPOSE A LIEN ON REAL PROPERTY AND
4 TO USE ALL THE REMEDIES THAT MAY BE USED FOR THE COLLECTION
5 OF DELINQUENT AD VALOREM TAXES.

7 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

8 Section 1. G.S. 153A-293 reads as rewritten:

9 "**§ 153A-293. Collection of fees in certain counties.**

10 (a) A county may provide that any fee imposed under G.S. 153A-292 may be
11 billed with the ad valorem taxes, may be payable in the same manner as ad valorem
12 taxes, and, in the case of nonpayment, may result in the imposition of a lien on the
13 property owner's real property in the same manner as ad valorem taxes.

14 (b) This section applies to Alleghany, Anson, Ashe, Burke, Caswell, Cleveland,
15 Columbus, Duplin, Gaston, Lee, Lenoir, Montgomery, Polk, Richmond, Robeson,
16 Transylvania, Washington, Watauga, and Wayne Counties only."

17 Sec. 2. Section 1 of Chapter 1007 of the 1989 Session laws reads as
18 rewritten:

19 "Section 1. (a) A county may provide that any fee imposed under G.S. 153A-292
20 may be billed with the ad valorem taxes, may be payable in the same manner as ad
21 valorem taxes, and, in the case of nonpayment, the same remedies may be used by a
22 county to collect such fees as are used to collect delinquent ad valorem taxes.

23 (b) This section applies to ~~Haywood~~ Columbus, Haywood, and Pender Counties
24 only."

1 Sec. 3. This act becomes effective upon ratification and applies to fees
2 imposed on or after July 1, 1991.
