4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. G.S. 163-278.6(18) reads as rewritten:
6	"(18) The term 'public office' means any office filled by election by the
7	people on a statewide, county, municipal or district basis, and thi
8	Article shall be applicable to such elective offices whether the
9	election therefor is partisan or nonpartisan, provided candidates fo
10	municipal and county offices in those municipalities and counties having
11	less than 50,000 population, according to the most recent decennia
12	census figures, shall not be required to file reports required by thi
13	Article, but this Article shall otherwise be applicable to such candidate
14	for municipal and county offices."
15	Sec. 2. G.S. 163-278.40 reads as rewritten:
16	"§ 163-278.40. Definitions.
17	When used in this Part, words and phrases have the same meaning as in G.S. 163
18	278.6, except that:
19	(1) The term 'board' means the county board of elections;
20	(2) The term 'city' means any incorporated city, town, or village with
21	population of 50,000 or over, according to the most recen
22	decennial federal census."

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Sec. 3. In any case where this act extends the reporting or filing requirement of Article 22A of Chapter 163 of the General Statutes to any candidate, political committee, or treasurer not previously covered, any future report or filing concerning any election in 1991 or 1992 shall account for any money on hand on the date of ratification of this act in accordance with rules to be adopted by the State Board of Elections.

Sec. 4. This act is effective upon ratification.
