A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS FOR
COSMETOLOGY TEACHERS AND TO REQUIRE ADEQUATE
VENTILATION IN SHOPS AND SCHOOLS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 88-23(a) reads as rewritten:

"§ 88-23. Rules and regulations of Board; inspections; granting of certificates to Board members; employment of former Board members.

- (a) (1) The State Board of Cosmetic Art Examiners shall have the authority to make a reasonable curriculum and rules for recognized schools and colleges of beauty culture and make reasonable rules and regulations for the sanitary management of cosmetic art shops, beauty parlors, hairdressing establishments, cosmetic art schools, colleges, academies and training schools, hereinafter called shops and schools, and to have such curriculum and rules and the sanitary rules and regulations enforced. The duly authorized agents of said Board shall have authority to enter upon and inspect any shop or school at any time during business hours. A copy of the curriculum and rules and the sanitary rules and regulations shall be furnished from the office of the Board or by the above mentioned authorized agents to the owner or manager of each shop or school in the State, and such copy shall be kept posted in a conspicuous place in each shop and school, and a copy of the curriculum and rules for recognized schools and colleges of beauty culture shall be kept

2 regulations complied with as required by this Chapter.
- 3 (2) The Board shall adopt regulations prohibiting the use of commercial
4 chemicals of unknown content by persons registered under this
5 Chapter. For purposes of this section, 'commercial chemicals' are
6 those products sold only through beauty and barber supply houses and
7 not available to the general public.
- 8 (3) The Board shall adopt regulations instructing persons registered under
9 this Chapter in the proper use and application of commercial chemicals
10 where no manufacturer's instructions are included. In the alternative,
11 the Board shall prohibit the use of such commercial chemicals by
12 persons registered under this Chapter.
- 13 (4) The Board shall adopt regulations requiring that cosmetology teachers
14 complete a minimum of 16 hours of continuing education every two
15 years. Effective October 1, 1993, the Board shall not renew the license
16 of any cosmetology teacher who has not satisfied the continuing
17 education requirements established by the Board.
- 18 (5) The Board shall adopt regulations requiring that adequate ventilation
19 be maintained in places where cosmetic art is practiced or taught.
20 Regulations adopted under this subdivision shall be enforced no earlier
21 than October 1, 1992."
- 22 Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
