## April 29, 1991

A JOINT RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE LEGISLATIVE RESEARCH COMMISSION TO STUDY INEQUITIES IN THE SALARIES OF EQUALLY QUALIFIED MINORITIES, FEMALES, AND NONMINORITY MALES WITHIN OCCUPATIONAL CATEGORIES IN STATE EMPLOYMENT.

Whereas, the employees of the State perform duties necessary for the efficient and effective functioning of State government; and

Whereas, maintaining a well qualified State employee work force benefits the people of the State; and

Whereas, in order to maintain a well-qualified work force, the State must compensate its employees fairly; and

Whereas, inequities in pay among equally qualified State employees would be adverse to employee morale, efficiency, and effectiveness; and

Whereas, legislation to correct pay inequities among State employees may be necessary to assure the efficient and effective functioning of State government;

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Senate, the House of Representatives concurring:

Section 1. The Legislative Research Commission may:

- (1) Examine within occupational categories salary inequities among equally qualified State employees within subgroups, specifically including minorities, females, and nonminority males.
- (2) Study the costs and benefits of correcting salary inequities among State employees.
- Sec. 2. For the purposes of this resolution:

1 2	(1) "Salary inequity" means a difference of at least ten percent (10%) between the salaries of employees in the same job classifications and
3	whose employment statuses are relatively equal with regard to the
4	following factors:
5	a. Education,
6	b. Related work experience,
7	c. Level within the organization,
8	d. Length of service, and
9	e. Performance level.
10	(2) "State employee"means an employee of any State agency, State
11	department, or The University of North Carolina.
12	Sec. 3. The Office of State Personnel of the Department of Administration
13	shall provide to the Legislative Research Commission personnel information and data
14	necessary for the study of State employee salary inequities. All other State agencies
15	State departments, and The University of North Carolina shall cooperate with the
16	Legislative Research Commission to the fullest extent possible in accordance with G.S
17	120-30.15.
18	Sec. 4. The Legislative Research Commission may make an interim report
19	including any recommendations, to the 1991 General Assembly, 1992 Session, and a
20	final report to the 1993 General Assembly.
21	Sec. 5. This resolution is effective upon ratification.
