1 Α JOINT RESOLUTION CREATING THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY'S 2 CONFERENCE ON ACCESS TO HEALTH CARE AND ESTABLISHING A CONFERENCE STEERING COMMITTEE 3 **STATEWIDE** FOR THE 4 CONFERENCE. Whereas, obtaining adequate health care is important for the future of North 5 Carolina's citizens; and 6 7 Whereas, many barriers contribute in preventing access to health care, such as not being able to afford physicians, insurance, or enough insurance, and not being able 8 9 to get to medical facilities when adequate facilities exist; and Whereas, the General Assembly has proposed to have a Conference on 10 Access to Health Care, which will allow the citizens of this State to come forward to 11 12 express their views on the problems they face in obtaining health care; Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Senate, the House of Representatives concurring; 13 Section 1. There is created the Joint Steering Committee for the North 14 Carolina General Assembly's Conference on Access to Health Care. 15 Sec. 2. The steering committee shall consist of the chairs of the House of 16 Representatives' standing committees on Appropriations, Education, and Human 17 Resources; the chairs of the Senate's standing committees on Appropriations, Education, 18 19 and Human Resources; 10 additional members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and 10 additional members appointed by the President Pro Tempore 20 of the Senate. These 20 additional members shall include members of the General 21

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Assembly, members of the business community, citizens, health care providers, and representatives of advocacy groups. The Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall each appoint at least two members of the political party to which the largest minority of the members of the General Assembly belong. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint the chair and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint the vice-chair of the steering committee.

8 Sec. 3. The steering committee shall investigate the feasibility of using 9 resources made available from the business community and philanthropic interest to 10 establish or facilitate in North Carolina during 1991 a one-day General Assembly's 11 Conference on Access to Health Care. If the steering committee determines that the 12 establishment of such a conference is feasible through these resources, the steering 13 committee shall establish and facilitate the conference through these resources.

14 Sec. 4. Members of the steering committee shall serve without compensation, 15 except that the legislative members of the committee may receive subsistence and travel 16 expenses from private funds at the rates set forth in G.S. 120-3.1.

17 Sec. 5. The steering committee shall establish program committees for four 18 public hearings, to provide a forum for all citizens of this State to present what they feel 19 are barriers to health care, the problems related to access to health care, and possible 20 solutions to these problems. From each public hearing, a position paper shall be 21 prepared to present to the General Assembly as a resource for addressing these issues 22 and drafting future legislation.

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Sec. 6. This resolution is effective upon ratification.
