A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO DIVIDE DISTRICT COURT DISTRICT 3 INTO DISTRICTS 3A AND 3B CONSISTENT WITH THE BOUNDARIES ESTABLISHED FOR SUPERIOR COURT AND PROSECUTORIAL DISTRICTS 3A AND 3B.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. Effective September 1, 1991, G.S. 7A-133 reads as rewritten:

"§ 7A-133. Numbers of judges by districts; numbers of magistrates and additional seats of court, by counties.

Each district court district shall have the numbers of judges and each county within the district shall have the numbers of magistrates and additional seats of court, as set forth in the following table:

23           Sec. 2. Effective September 1, 1991, David Leech, E. Burt Aycock, and  
 24 James E. Martin, or their successors, shall be district court judges for district court  
 25 district 3A. Effective September 1, 1991, George Wainright, James Ragan, W. Lee  
 26 Lumpkin, and H. Horton Roundtree, or their successors, shall be district court judges for  
 27 district court district 3B.

28           Sec. 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Judicial  
 29 Department the sum of \$150,376 for the 1991-92 fiscal year and the sum of \$130,751  
 30 for the 1992-93 fiscal year to implement this act.

31           Sec. 4. This act becomes effective September 1, 1991.
