3	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
4	Section 1. Chapter 120 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new
5	Article to read:

7	"LEGISLATIVE BUDGET COMMISSION.
8	" <u>§ 120-192. Establishment of Commission; purpose.</u>
9	There is established the Legislative Budget Commission. The purpose of the
10	<u>Commission is to provide to the General Assembly the information it needs (i)</u> to
11	consider the comprehensive budget of the anticipated revenue and proposed
12	expenditures of the State submitted to it by the Governor, and (ii) to enact a balanced
13	budget for the State.

16	(1) <u>'State agency' means all institutions, departments, bureaus, boards,</u>
17	commissions, and agencies of the State and all private corporations,
18	persons, and organizations of all kinds, that are subject to the

10	(a) <u>The President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of</u>
11	Representatives shall each designate a cochairman of the Legislative Budget
12	Commission. Either of the cochairmen may call a meeting of the Commission.
13	(b) While in the discharge of its official duties, the Commission has the powers
14	of a joint committee under G.S. 120-19 and G.S. 120-19.1 through G.S. 120-19.4.
15	(c) <u>Members of the Commission shall receive subsistence and travel expenses as</u>
16	provided in G.S. 120-3.1. The Commission may contract for consultants or hire
17	employees in accordance with G.S. 120-32.02. The Legislative Services Commission,
18	through the Legislative Administrative Officer, shall assign professional staff to assist
19	the Commission in its work. Upon the direction of the Legislative Services
20	Commission, the Supervisors of Clerks of the Senate and of the House of
21	Representatives shall assign clerical staff to the Commission. The expenses for clerical
22	employees shall be borne by the Commission."

24	"(4d) The Legislative Budget Commission."
25	Sec. 3. The Legislative Services Commission may use funds available to the
26	General Assembly for the 1992-93 fiscal year for the operations of the Legislative
27	Budget Commission.

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Sec. 4. This act is effective upon ratification.
