A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO ABOLISH A DISTRICT COURT JUDGESHIP IN DISTRICT COURT DISTRICT SEVEN.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. Effective on this first Monday in December of 1996, G.S. 7A-133 reads as rewritten:

"§ 7A-133. Numbers of judges by districts; numbers of magistrates and additional seats of court, by counties.

Each district court district shall have the numbers of judges and each county within the district shall have the numbers of magistrates and additional seats of court, as set forth in the following table:
