## CHAPTER 525 HOUSE BILL 1095

# AN ACT TO PROHIBIT INSURERS FROM REQUIRING THE USE OF SPECIFIED REPAIR COMPANIES FOR MOTOR VEHICLE DAMAGE REPAIRS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 58-33-76 reads as rewritten:

#### "§ 58-33-76. Referral of business to repair source; prohibitions.

- (a) No <u>insurance company</u>, <u>agent</u>, <u>adjuster or appraiser or any person employed to perform their service</u> shall recommend the use of a particular service or source for the repair of property damage without clearly informing the claimant that the claimant is under no obligation to use the recommended repair service.
- (b) No <u>insurance company</u>, <u>agent</u>, <u>adjuster or appraiser or any person employed to perform their service</u> shall accept any gratuity or other form of remuneration from a repair service for recommending that repair service to a claimant. <u>Provided</u>, <u>however</u>, discounts agreed to by repair services shall not violate this section.
- (c) Any person who violates this section is subject to the provisions of G.S. 58-2-70 and G.S. 58-33-45."
- Sec. 2. Chapter 58 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

# "§ 58-3-170. Motor vehicle repairs; selection by claimant.

- (a) A policy covering damage to a motor vehicle shall allow the claimant to select the repair service or source for the repair of the damage.
- (b) The amount determined by the insurer to be payable under a policy covering damage to a motor vehicle shall be paid regardless of the repair service or source selected by the claimant.
- (c) Any person who violates this section is subject to the applicable provisions of G.S. 58-2-70 and G.S. 58-33-45, provided that the maximum civil penalty that can be assessed under G.S. 58-2-70(d) for a violation of this section is two thousand dollars (\$2,000)."

Sec. 3. This act is effective upon ratification and applies to policies with a renewal, inception, or anniversary date on or after October 1, 1993.

In the General Assembly read three times and ratified this the 24th day of July, 1993.
