A BILL TO BE ENTITLEBIL

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR THE RECONSTRUCTION OF HISTORICAL BUILDINGS, TO PROVIDE STAFF, AND TO COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT AT SOMERSET PLACE STATE HISTORIC SITE.

Whereas, Somerset Place was designated a State Historic Site in 1967 by the Division of Archives and History for the purpose of preserving and interpreting the history of one of the State's largest and most profitable antebellum plantations, including the history, culture, and heritage of the more than 350 Americans of African descent who undergirded its prosperity; and

Whereas, today, nothing remains of the buildings where Somerset's African American community lived and worked; nothing remains to accurately tell their story and validate their lives; and

Whereas, the General Assembly of the State of North Carolina believes all of our citizens, current and future, deserve full, accurate, and culturally affirming inclusion in all presentations of this State's history and access to that history regardless of their physical limitations; Now, therefore,

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Cultural Resources, Division of Archives and History, the sum of nine hundred seventy-three thousand dollars (\$973,000) for fiscal year 1993-94 for research, design, and reconstruction of the slave hospital, chapel, kitchen, and other improvements at Somerset Place State Historic Site, and to bring the buildings and other site facilities into compliance with the requirements of The Americans With Disabilities Act of 1990.

Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
Cultural Resources, Division of Archives and History, the sum of seventy thousand five
hundred forty-five dollars (\$70,545) for the 1993-94 fiscal year and the sum of seventy
thousand five hundred forty-five dollars (\$70,545) for the 1994-95 fiscal year for the
establishment of four positions: one Grade 66 program specialist; one Grade 56
grounds worker; one Grade 68 restoration/construction specialist; and one Grade 67
Archaeologist I, for planning, implementing, and maintaining all site improvements.
Sec. 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 1993.
