A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

**AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC
EDUCATION FOR THE TOMORROW ACADEMY PILOT SCHOOLS, WHICH
SHALL BE MODEL PROGRESSION SCHOOLS LOCATED IN AN URBAN
AND A RURAL AREA.**

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Education the sum of two million one hundred thirteen thousand forty dollars (\$2,113,040) for the 1993-94 fiscal year and the sum of one million nine hundred twelve thousand dollars (\$1,912,000) for the 1994-95 fiscal year for the Tomorrow Academy Pilot Schools. The Tomorrow Academy Pilot Schools shall be located in the Wake County School Administrative Unit and in the Rocky Mount/Nash County School Administrative Units. The schools shall be model progression schools for children with intense social and educational needs that will serve as a model for the State. The schools shall use the Cities In Schools (CIS) service delivery model, which coordinates delivery of existing health, social, education, and other support services to educational sites to reconnect children who are disruptive or alienated from school. Teachers shall use an interdisciplinary curriculum, coupled with the best and most appropriate instructional techniques and strategies including technology to provide students with a unique and successful learning environment.

Sec. 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1993.
