1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT LOW-INCOME CITIZENS' PURCHASES OF FUEL 3 FOR HOME ENERGY ARE EXEMPT FROM SALES TAX. 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 5 Section 1. G.S. 105-164.13 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read: 6 "(41) Sales of fuel for home use to individuals who are eligible for 7 assistance from the low-income home energy assistance program 8 established in G.S. 108A-25. In order to qualify for this exemption, the buyer must provide the seller (i) a copy of the certificate issued by 9 the Department of Human Resources verifying that the buyer is 10 eligible for assistance from the low-income home energy assistance 11 12 program and (ii) a certificate signed by the buyer verifying that the buyer intends to use the fuel for home use. As used in this 13 subdivision, the term 'fuel' includes electricity, liquid propane gas, 14 natural gas, kerosene, fuel oil, and wood." 15

Sec. 2. Article 2 of Chapter 108A of the General Statutes is amended by adding at the end a new Part to read:

"PART 7. LOW-INCOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

"§ 108A-70. Low-income energy assistance program certificate.

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The Department of Human Resources shall provide each recipient of benefits under the low-income home energy assistance program a certificate verifying that the individual is eligible for assistance from the program. The certificate shall contain the

- 1 <u>individual's name, address, and social security number, shall state the date it was issued,</u>
- 2 and shall state that it expires one year from the date it was issued."
- Sec. 3. This act becomes effective January 1, 1994, and applies to sales made
- 4 on or after that date.
