A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT TO MAKE IT A FELONY TO ASSAULT AN EDUCATOR AND TO
APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO INFORM STUDENTS OF THIS ACT.
The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
Section 1. Article 8 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by
adding a new section to read:
"§ 14-32.3. Assault on an educator.
(a) For the purpose of this section, the term 'educator' includes a member of the
administrative staff, coaching staff, teaching staff, a teacher's aid, or a guidance
counselor at a private or public school.
(b) A person, 14 years old or older, who assaults an educator is guilty of a Class J
felony if:
(1) The educator was discharging official duties at the time of the assault;
or The second se
(2) The assault occurred on the grounds of the school at which the
educator is employed.
(c) A person convicted of an offense under this section shall serve a mandatory
minimum term of imprisonment of no less than 90 days. The sentencing judge may not
suspend the mandatory 90-day term of imprisonment or place the person on probation
for the mandatory 90-day term of imprisonment. During that time the prisoner is not
eligible for early parole or early release."

- Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Instruction the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) for the 1993-94 fiscal year to inform students of this act.
- Sec. 3. This act becomes effective December 1, 1993, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
