4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:				
5		Sectio	n 1. G.S. 20-79.4(b) reads as rewritten:		
6	"(b)	Types	The Division shall issue the following types of special registration		
7	plates:				
8		(1)	Administrative Officer of the Courts. – Issuable to the Director of the		
9			Administrative Office of the Courts. The plate shall bear the phrase 'J-		
10			20'.		
11		(2)	Amateur Radio Operator. – Issuable to an amateur radio operator who		
12			holds an unexpired and unrevoked amateur radio license issued by the		
13			Federal Communications Commission and who asserts to the Division		
14			that a portable transceiver is carried in the vehicle. The plate shall bear		
15			the phrase 'Amateur Radio.' The plate shall bear the operator's official		
16			amateur radio call letters, or call letters with numerical or letter		
17			suffixes so that an owner of more than one vehicle may have the call		
18			letters on each.		
19		(3)	Civil Air Patrol Member. – Issuable to an active member of the North		
20			Carolina Wing of the Civil Air Patrol. The plate shall bear the phrase		
21			'Civil Air Patrol'. A plate issued to an officer member shall begin with		
22			the number '201' and the number shall reflect the seniority of the

1		member; a plate issued to an enlisted member, a senior member, or a
2		cadet member shall begin with the number '501'.
3	(4)	Class D Citizen's Radio Station Operator Issuable to a Class D
4		citizen's radio station operator licensed by the Federal
5		Communications Commission. The plate shall bear the operator's
6		official Class D citizen's radio station call letters.
7	(5)	Clerk of Superior Court Issuable to a clerk of superior court. The
8		plate shall bear the phrase 'Clerk Superior Court' and the letter 'C'
9		followed by a number that indicates the county the clerk serves.
10	(6)	Coast Guard Auxiliary Member Issuable to an active member of the
11	~ /	United States Coast Guard Auxiliary. The plate shall bear the phrase
12		'Coast Guard Auxiliary'.
13	(6a)	Collegiate Insignia Plate. – Issuable to the registered owner of a motor
14		vehicle in accordance with G.S. 20-81.12. The plate may bear a phrase
15		or an insignia representing a public or private college or university.
16	(7)	Congressional Medal of Honor Recipient. – Issuable to a recipient of
17		the Congressional Medal of Honor.
18	(8)	Disabled Veteran. – Issuable to a veteran of the armed forces of the
19	(-)	United States who suffered a 100% service-connected disability.
20	(9)	District Attorney Issuable to a North Carolina or United States
21		District Attorney. The plate issuable to a North Carolina district
22		attorney shall bear the letters 'DA' followed by a number that
23		represents the prosecutorial district the district attorney serves. The
24		plate for a United States attorney shall bear the phrase 'U.S. Attorney'
25		followed by a number that represents the district the attorney serves,
26		with 1 being the Eastern District, 2 being the Middle District, and 3
27		being the Western District.
28	(10)	Fire Department or Rescue Squad Member. – Issuable to an active
29	()	regular member or volunteer member of a fire department, rescue
30		squad, or both a fire department and rescue squad. The plate shall bear
31		the words 'Firefighter', 'Rescue Squad', or 'Firefighter-Rescue Squad'.
32	(11)	Historic Vehicle Owner. – Issuable for a motor vehicle that is at least
33	()	35 years old measured from the date of manufacture. The plate for a
34		vehicle that is 35 to 50 years old shall bear the phrase 'Antique'. The
35		plate for a vehicle that is at least 50 years old shall bear the phrase
36		'Horseless Carriage'.
37	(11a)	Historical Attraction Plate. – Issuable to the registered owner of a
38	(114)	motor vehicle in accordance with G.S. 20-81.12. The plate may bear a
39		phrase or an insignia representing a publicly owned or nonprofit
40		historical attraction located in North Carolina.
41	(12)	Honorary Plate. – Issuable to a member of the Honorary Consulor
42	(12)	<u>Consular</u> Corps, who has been certified by the U. S. State Department,
43		the plate shall bear the words 'Honorary Consular Corps' and
44		a distinguishing number based on the order of issuance.

1		(13)	Judge or Justice Issuable to a sitting or retired judge or justice in
2		<i></i>	accordance with G.S. 20-79.6.
3		(14)	Legislator. – Issuable to a member of the North Carolina General
4			Assembly. The plate shall bear the words 'Senate' or 'State House'
5		(15)	followed by the Senator's or Representative's assigned seat number.
6		(15)	Marshal. – Issuable to a United States Marshal. The plate shall bear the
7			phrase 'U.S. Marshal' followed by a number that represents the district
8 9			the Marshal serves, with 1 being the Eastern District, 2 being the Middle District, and 2 being the Western District
9 10		(16)	Middle District, and 3 being the Western District.
10		(16)	Military Reservist. – Issuable to a member of a reserve component of the armed forces of the United States. The plate shall bear the name
11			and insignia of the appropriate reserve component. Plates shall be
12			numbered sequentially for members of a component with the numbers
14			1 through 5000 reserved for officers, without regard to rank.
15		(16a)	Military Retiree. – Issuable to an individual who has retired from the
16		(100)	armed forces of the United States. The plate shall bear the phrase 'U.S.
17			Armed Forces Retired' and the name of the branch of service from
18			which the individual retired.
19		(17)	National Guard Member. – Issuable to an active or a retired member of
20			the North Carolina National Guard. The plate shall bear the phrase
21			'National Guard'. A plate issued to an active member shall bear a
22			number that reflects the seniority of the member; a plate issued to a
23			commissioned officer shall begin with the number '1'; a plate issued to
24			a noncommissioned officer with a rank of E7, E8, or E9 shall begin
25			with the number '1601'; a plate issued to an enlisted member with a
26			rank of E6 or below shall begin with the number '3001'. The plate
27			issued to a retired or separated member shall indicate the member's
28		(10)	retired status.
29		(18)	Partially Disabled Veteran. – Issuable to a veteran of the armed forces
30			of the United States who suffered a service connected disability of less than 100%.
31 32		(10)	Pearl Harbor Survivor. – Issuable to a veteran of the armed forces of
32 33		(19)	the United States who was present at and survived the attack on Pearl
34			Harbor on December 7, 1941. The plate will bear the phrase 'Pearl
35			Harbor Survivor' and the insignia of the Pearl Harbor Survivors'
36			Association.
37		(20)	Personalized. – Issuable to the registered owner of a motor vehicle.
38		(==)	The plate will bear the letters or letters and numbers requested by the
39			owner. The Division may refuse to issue a plate with a letter
40			combination that is offensive to good taste and decency. The Division
41			may not issue a plate that duplicates another plate.
42		(21)	Prisoner of War. – Issuable to a member or veteran member of the
43			armed forces of the United States who has been captured and held

1		prisoner by forces hostile to the United States while serving in the	
2		armed forces.	
3	(22)	Purple Heart Recipient. – Issuable to a recipient of the Purple Heart	
4	(22)	award. The plate shall bear the phrase 'Purple Heart Veteran, Combat	
5		Wounded' and the letters 'PH'.	
6	(22a)	Shriner. – Issuable to a member of the Shriners, A.A.O.N.M.S. The	
7	<u>(22u)</u>	plate shall bear the phrase 'Shriner' and shall bear the insignia of the	
8		organization pursuant to G.S. 20-81.12(b1).	
9	(23)	State Government Official. – Issuable to elected and appointed	
10	()	members of State government in accordance with G.S. 20-79.5.	
11	(24)	Street Rod Owner. – Issuable to the registered owner of a modernized	
12		private passenger motor vehicle manufactured prior to the year 1949 or	
13		designed to resemble a vehicle manufactured prior to the year 1949.	
14		The plate shall bear the phrase 'Street Rod'.	
15	(25)	Transportation Personnel Issuable to various members of the	
16		Divisions of the Department of Transportation. The plate shall bear the	
17		letters 'DOT' followed by a number from 1 to 85, as designated by the	
18		Governor.	
19	(26)	U.S. Representative Issuable to a United States Representative for	
20		North Carolina. The plate shall bear the phrase 'U.S. House' and shall	
21		be issued on the basis of Congressional district numbers.	
22	(27)	U.S. Senator. – Issuable to a United States Senator for North Carolina.	
23		The plates shall bear the phrase 'U.S. Senate' and shall be issued on the	
24		basis of seniority represented by the numbers 1 and 2."	
25		. G.S. 20-81.12 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:	
26		ers Plates. – The Division must receive 300 or more applications for a	
27		before a plate may be developed. In developing the plate, the	
28		hall consult with the Oasis Shrine Temple, Charlotte; the Amran Shrine	
29	Temple, Raleigh; and the Sudan Shrine Temple, New Bern, and if there are 300 or more		
30	applications from any of these individual organizations, the Commissioner may vary the		
31	insignia and wording appearing on the Shriner plates to reflect the membership of the		
32	applicant in the local temple."
