A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO RAISE THE FORCE ACCOUNT LIMIT FOR THE CITY OF 3 MOORESVILLE. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 4 Section 1. G.S. 143-135 reads as rewritten: 5 6 "§ 143-135. Limitation of application of Article. Except for the provisions of G.S. 143-129 requiring bids for the purchase of 7 apparatus, supplies, materials or equipment, this Article shall not apply to construction 8 9 or repair work undertaken by the State or by subdivisions of the State of North Carolina (i) when the work is performed by duly elected officers or agents using force account 10 qualified labor on the permanent payroll of the agency concerned and (ii) when the total 11 cost of the project, including without limitation all direct and indirect costs of labor, 12 services, materials, supplies and equipment, does not exceed seventy five thousand 13 dollars (\$75,000). two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000). Such force account 14 work shall be subject to the approval of the Director of the Budget in the case of State 15 agencies, of the responsible commission, council, or board in the case of subdivisions of 16 17 the State. Complete and accurate records of the entire cost of such work, including without limitation, all direct and indirect costs of labor, services, materials, supplies and 18 19 equipment performed and furnished in the prosecution and completion thereof, shall be maintained by such agency, commission, council or board for the inspection by the 20 general public. Construction or repair work undertaken pursuant to this section shall not 21 be divided for the purposes of evading the provisions of this Article." 22 Sec. 2. This act applies to the City of Mooresville only, and shall expire on 23

December 31, 1994, and applies only to the renovation of the old Carolina Tire Building into a fire station.
