1 AN ACT TO RAISE THE FORCE ACCOUNT LIMIT FOR THE CITY OF
2 MOORESVILLE.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 Section 1. G.S. 143-135 reads as rewritten:

6 "**§ 143-135. Limitation of application of Article.**

7 Except for the provisions of G.S. 143-129 requiring bids for the purchase of
8 apparatus, supplies, materials or equipment, this Article shall not apply to construction
9 or repair work undertaken by the State or by subdivisions of the State of North Carolina
10 (i) when the work is performed by duly elected officers or agents using force account
11 qualified labor on the permanent payroll of the agency concerned and (ii) when the total
12 cost of the project, including without limitation all direct and indirect costs of labor,
13 services, materials, supplies and equipment, does not exceed ~~seventy five thousand~~
14 ~~dollars (\$75,000).~~ two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000). Such force account
15 work shall be subject to the approval of the Director of the Budget in the case of State
16 agencies, of the responsible commission, council, or board in the case of subdivisions of
17 the State. Complete and accurate records of the entire cost of such work, including
18 without limitation, all direct and indirect costs of labor, services, materials, supplies and
19 equipment performed and furnished in the prosecution and completion thereof, shall be
20 maintained by such agency, commission, council or board for the inspection by the
21 general public. Construction or repair work undertaken pursuant to this section shall not
22 be divided for the purposes of evading the provisions of this Article."

23 Sec. 2. This act applies to the City of Mooresville only, and shall expire on
24 December 31, 1994, and applies only to the renovation of the old Carolina Tire Building
25 into a fire station.

26 Sec. 3. This act is effective upon ratification.
