6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	Section 1. The General Statutes are amended by adding a new Chapter to

14	This Chapter may be cited as the 'North Carolina Law Enforcement Officers' Hall of
15	Honor Act of 1993'.
16	" <u>§ 114A-1-2. Findings and policy.</u>
17	The General Assembly finds that the provision of effective law enforcement depends
18	upon the daily selfless service of thousands of dedicated officers who frequently place
19	themselves in great danger in performing their duties. This record of achievement must

2	(c) Vacancies. When an individual ceases to hold the office or position required
4	for appointment to the Committee, then he or she shall cease to be qualified for
5	membership on the Committee and that seat becomes vacated. Any individual
6	appointed or designated to serve on this Committee shall serve until his successor is
7	appointed of designated to serve on this committee shan serve until his successor is appointed and qualified.
8	(d) Compensation. None of the members of the Committee shall receive
9	compensation for serving on the Committee. However, if funds are available, then
10	members of the Committee who are State officers or employees may be reimbursed for
11	their expenses in accordance with G.S. 138-6; members of the Committee who are full-
12	time salaried public officers or employees other than State officers or employees may be
13	reimbursed for their expenses in accordance with G.S. 138-5(b). All other members of
14	the Committee may receive compensation and reimbursement for expenses in
15	accordance with G.S. 138-5(b).
16	(e) Officer. The Attorney General shall serve as chair of the Committee. Other
17	officers as the Committee may deem necessary shall be elected from the membership.
18	Officers of the Committee shall be elected at the first regular meeting after July 1 of
19	each year. All officers of the Committee shall serve for one year, or until successors are
20	<u>qualified.</u>
21	(f) <u>Removal. Upon giving reasonable notice to a member, the Committee may</u>
22	remove the member for misfeasance, malfeasance, nonfeasance, or neglect of duty.
23	(g) Meetings. The Committee shall meet as often as necessary and at the call of
24	the chair but no less than four times a year.
25	(h) Duties. The Committee shall plan, erect, administer, and maintain the North
26	Carolina Law Enforcement Officers' Hall of Honor in the manner it determines to be
27	appropriate, but generally in accordance with the following:
28 29	(1) All officers certified by the provisions of Chapters 17C, 17E, or 74E of the Conoral Statutae shall be aligible for entry into the Hall of Hangr

41	" <u>§ 114A-3-1. Functions of the Department of Justice.</u>
42	(a) The Committee, by adoption of rules pursuant to the provisions of Chapter
43	150B of the General Statutes, shall provide for the administration of the Fund

1	established by this Chapter. In consultation with the Attorney General the Committee
2	<u>shall:</u>
3	(1) Establish reasonable and equitable procedures to disburse funds to
4	establish and operate the Hall of Honor;
5	(2) Promote the most efficient and economical program of public
6	information on the subject of the Hall of Honor; and
7	(3) Establish a system of selecting officers for entry into the North
8	Carolina Law Enforcement Officers' Hall of Honor. All selections of
9	persons to Hall of Honor membership shall be made by a majority vote
10	of the Committee.
11	(b) The Attorney General shall provide such staff as is necessary to administer
12	the programs of the Committee. Such staffing shall be provided through the resources
13	of the Fund as provided in G.S. 114A-3-2.
14	(c) The Attorney General shall have legal custody of all books, papers,
15	documents, or other records and property of the Fund or the Committee and the Hall of
16	Honor.
17	"§ 114A-3-2. North Carolina Law Enforcement Officers' Hall of Honor Fund
18	established.
19	(a) There is established the North Carolina Law Enforcement Officers' Hall of
20	Honor Fund in the Department of Justice. Any surplus in the Fund shall not revert. The
21	Fund shall be kept on deposit with the State Treasurer, as in the case of other State
22	funds, and may be invested by the State Treasurer in any lawful security for the
23	investment of State money. The income or other earnings from such investments shall
24	be paid to the Fund. The Fund is subject to the oversight of the State Auditor pursuant
25	to Article 5A of Chapter 147 of the General Statutes.
26	(b) In addition to monies deposited in the Fund pursuant to the provisions of this
27	Article, the Attorney General may accept into the Fund for the purposes of this Chapter,
28	any donations of real or personal property and grants of money from any governmental
29	unit or public agency, or from any institution, person, firm, or corporation. The
30	Attorney General shall include in the annual report required by G.S. 114A-3-3 a
31	summary of the donations, gifts, or grants, the identity of the donor, the nature of the
32	transaction, and the conditions, if any.
33	(c) The resources of the North Carolina Law Enforcement Officers' Hall of
34	Honor Fund shall be expended only for the support of activities relative to the planning,
35	construction, administration, and maintenance of the Hall of Honor.
36	" <u>§ 114A-3-3. Annual report.</u>
37	The Attorney General shall cause an annual report of the Fund to be presented to the
38	General Assembly on or before December 31 of each year for the preceding fiscal year.
39	Such annual report shall contain a summary of all disbursements made from the Fund
40	by type, level of government, governmental unit, and any other matters that may be
41	included at the direction of the committee."
42	Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
43	Justice the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the 1993-94 fiscal year and the

sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the 1994-95 fiscal year for establishment of

- 3 Sec. 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 1993.

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
